Marylebone Village

Marylebone village, which encompasses Regent's Park, Baker Street and Lisson Grove, is a sought- after area of Central London which centres around Marylebone High Street and its surrounding stylish shopping streets.

Battersea Power Station

The unused power station was the first British coal-fired electricity station set up in the 1930's and now dominates the Battersea skyline. The station gained worldwide recognition having appeared on the cover of Pink Floyd's 1977 album, Animals.

Battersea Park

Set over 200 acres of green space, Battersea Park, situated on the bank of the Thames, is considered by many to be the most attractive of London parks. With its historic gardens, diverse natural flora and even a zoo, the park has something to offer everyone.

Sherlock Holmes Museum

Sherlock Holmes lived here at 221B Baker Street between 1881 - 1904 and the house is now protected by the Government. It is privately-run museum run by the Sherlock Holmes International Society.

Fitzroy Tavern

The area of Fitzrovia was named after this pub in the 1930's when the Fitzroy Tavern was frequented by writers, artists, sculptors, composers and poets. It is very popular with UCL students and is also home to the Pear Shaped Comedy Club every Wednesday.
